

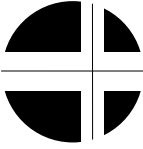

2013 Coordinated Public Transit - Human Services Transportation Plan- Executive Summary

Overview

The Coordinated Public Transit - Human Services Transportation Plan (Coordinated Plan) for the Clark County-Springfield TCC Planning Area is a five year planning document that is re-evaluated and updated by the Transportation Study, with the cooperation and participation of all participating public, private, and non-profit transportation providers, human service agencies and municipalities in Clark County.

The Coordinated Plan serves many purposes. It is a supporting document for local programming in the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). It serves as a reference for the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) and the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) as those offices review and approve cash grant applications for operating, capital, mobility management and planning projects of the 5310, 5316 and 5317 programs.

Finally, the Coordinated Plan will serve as a catalyst for building consolidated services among participating agencies and providers and will guide the Clark County Human Services Transportation Provider's Council in its pursuit of coordination.

Revisions to 2008 Coordinated Plan (What's New?)

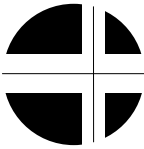
Primary revisions include formatting and grammatical changes to make the Coordinated Plan more effective and contemporary to current transportation needs.

All Census data that is used in the Plan is data collected from the 2000 US Census and is subject to change through TCC Board approval upon the receipt of updated 2010 data.

Section 1.0 Background - Only format and grammatical changes in this section

Section 2.0 Introduction - Format and grammatical changes, as well as the addition of the five-point outline of 2004 key recommendations as submitted to the President of the United States, by the Federal Interagency Coordinating Council on Access and Mobility.

Section 3.0 Provider Inventory - This section is new to the document and replaces the "Mobility Today" section of the 2008 Plan. A complete update of transportation providers



is included, along with data provided through the Human Services Provider's Survey and the Clark County Human Services Transportation Council. Appendix documents to this section include Appendix A - Transportation Provider's Details and Appendix B - Transportation Provider's Survey and Survey Results.

Section 4.0 Public Outreach - This section is new to the document and replaces the "Public Transportation Assessment" of the 2008 Plan. This section identifies changes over the last planning period that demonstrates the formation of an updated Public Participation Policy and the Citizen Advisory Committee. TCC staff has developed new methods for gaining maximum response when engaging the public with study activities. Appendix documents to this section include Appendix C - Public Survey and Public Survey Response, Appendix D - Human Services Transportation Council Meeting Details, Appendix E - Citizen's Advisory Committee Meetings, and Appendix I - Public Meetings Record of Events.

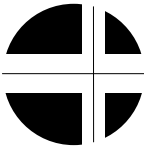
Section 5.0 Demographics and Services - This section is new to the document and replaces the "Environmental Justice Consideration" of the 2008 Plan. It also identifies current public transit services that are available in the TCC planning area. The Appendix document to this section is Appendix F - Demographics Mapping. Please note that this section and appendix will be updated when detailed 2010 US Census data is available.

Section 6.0 Gaps & Needs - This section is new to the document and draws findings and responses of both the public and provider's surveys. This information will be utilized with the Human Services Transportation Council.

Section 7.0 Coordination Benefits - New to the Plan, this section was added as an overview of the economic and social benefits of coordinated activities.

Section 8.0 Funding Sources - New to the Plan, This section highlights the non-DOT Federal funds that can be utilized to aid in public and human services transportation projects. The appendix to this section is Appendix G - Federal Funding Source Guide.

Section 9.0 Strategies & Actions - Derived from the local gaps and needs findings and identified by the Human Services Transportation Council. The appendix to this section is Appendix H - Strategies and Goals Prioritization.

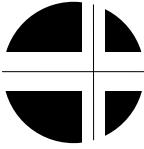

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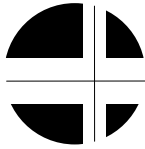
